1. Introduction

2.5 Interpretations and Addenda

Respondents are expected to examine the RFP with care and observe all its requirements. All questions about the meaning or intent of this RFP, all interpretations and clarifications considered necessary by the owner's representative in response to such comments and questions will be issued by Addenda mailed or delivered to all parties recorded as having received the RFP package. Only comments and questions responded to by formal written Addenda will be binding. Oral interpretations, statements or clarifications are without legal effect.

2.6 Quantities of Estimate

Wherever the estimated quantities of work to be done are shown in any section of this RFP, including the Proposal Cost Form, they are given for use in comparing proposals. The owner especially reserves the right (except as herein otherwise specifically limited) to increase or diminish the quantities as may be deemed reasonably necessary or desirable by the owner to complete the work detailed by the contract. Such increase or diminution shall in no way violate this contract, nor shall any such increase or diminution give cause for claims or liability for damages.

2.7 Cost Liability and Additional Costs

The owner assumes no responsibility and liability for costs incurred by the Respondents prior to the issuance of an agreement. The liability of the owner shall be limited to the terms and conditions of the contract.

Respondents will assume responsibility for all costs not stated in their proposals. All unit rates either stated in the proposal or used as a basis for its pricing are required to be all-inclusive. Additional charges, unless incurred for additional work performed by request of the owner as noted in 2.6, are not to be billed and will not be paid.

2.8 Statutory and Other Requirements

2.8.1 Compliance with Laws

Any contract entered into between the contractor and the owner must be in accordance with and subject to compliance by both parties with the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law. The contractor must agree to comply with the non-discrimination provisions and all other laws and regulations applicable to the performance of services there under. The respondent shall sign and acknowledge such forms and certificates as may be required by this section.

2.8.2 MANDATORY EEO/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION EVIDENCE – N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17-27 et seq.

No firm may be issued a contract unless it complies with the affirmative action provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27-1 et seq. as administered by the Division of Purchase & Property Contract Compliance and Audit Unit (Division) and provided below. The contract will include the language included as attachment A in this specification.

- 1. <u>Goods, Professional Services and Service Contracts</u> Each contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:
 - i. A Letter of Federal Approval indicating that the vendor is under an existing federally approved or sanctioned affirmative action program. A copy of the letter must be provided by the vendor to the Public Agency and Division. This approval letter is valid for one year from the date of issuance.
 - ii. A Certificate of Employee Information Report (hereafter "Certificate"), issued in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27 et seq. The vendor must provide a copy of the Certificate to the Public Agency as evidence of its compliance with the regulations. The Certificate represents the review and approval of the vendor's Employee Information Report, Form AA-302 by the Division
 - iii. The successful respondent shall complete an Initial Employee Report, Form AA-302 and submit it to the Division with a check or money order for \$150.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of New Jersey" <u>www.state.nj.us/treasury/contract_compliance</u>

2.8.3 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 - 42 U.S.C. S121 01 et seq.

Discrimination on the basis of disability in contracting for the delivery of services is prohibited. Respondents are required to read American with Disabilities language that is part of the documents attached hereto and agree that the provisions of Title II of the Act are made part of the contract. The contractor is obligated to comply with the Act and hold the owner harmless.

2.8.4 Statement of Corporate Ownership-Stockholder Disclosure - N.J.S.A. 52:25-24.2 (P.L. 1977 c.33)

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:25-24.2, no corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability corporation, limited liability partnership, Subchapter S corporation or sole proprietorship, shall be awarded a contract, unless prior to the receipt of the RFP response/bid or accompanying the RFP response/bid of the corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability corporation, limited liability partnership, subchapter S corporation or sole proprietorship, there is submitted to the County a statement setting forth the names and addresses of all stockholders who own 10% or more of the stock, of any class or of all individual partners who own a 10% or greater interest in the corporation, partnership, limited

partnership, limited liability corporation, limited liability partnership, Subchapter S corporation or sole proprietorship. If one or more such stockholder or partner is itself a corporation or partnership, the stockholders holding 10% or more of that corporation's stock, or the individual partners owning 10% or greater interest in that partnership, as the case may be, shall also be listed. The disclosure shall be continued until names and addresses of every non-corporate stockholder and individual partner, exceeding the 10% ownership criteria established in this act has been listed. The form shall be signed and submitted with the RFP proposal/bid whether or not a stockholder or partner owns less than 10% of the business submitting the RFP proposal/bid. Failure to comply requires mandatory rejection of the RFP proposal/bid. The Respondent shall complete and submit the form of statement that is included in this RFP.

2.8.5 Non-Collusion Affidavit - N.J.S.A. 52:34-15

The Non-Collusion Affidavit, which is part of this RFP, shall be properly executed and submitted with the RFP response.

2.8.6 Proof of N.J. Business Registration Certificate - N.J.S.A. 52:32-44

Pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 52:32-44, Somerset County ("Contracting Agency") is prohibited from entering into a contract with an entity unless the bidder/proposer/contractor, and each subcontractor that is required by law to be named in a bid/proposal/contract has a valid Business Registration Certificate on file with the Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services within the Department of the Treasury.

Prior to contract award or authorization, the contractor shall provide the Contracting Agency with its proof of business registration and that of any named subcontractor(s).

Subcontractors named in a bid or proposal shall provide proof of business registration to the bidder, who in turn, shall provide it to the Contracting Agency prior to the time of contract, purchase order, or other contracting document is awarded or authorized.

During the course of contract performance:

- (1) The contractor shall not enter into a contract with a subcontractor unless the subcontractor first provides the contractor with a valid proof of business registration.
- (2) The contractor shall maintain and submit to the Contracting Agency a list of subcontractors and their addresses that may be updated from time to time.
- (3) The contractor and any subcontractor providing goods or performing services under the contract, and each of their affiliates, shall collect and remit to the Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of Treasury, the use tax due pursuant to the Sales and Use Tax Act, (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq.) on all sales of tangible personal property delivered in the State. Any questions in this regard can be directed to the Division of Taxation at (609) 292-6400. Form NJ-REG can be filed online at www.state.nj.us/treasury/revenue/busregcert.shtml.

Before final payment is made under the contract, the contractor shall submit to the Contracting Agency a complete and accurate list of all subcontractors used and their addresses.

Pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 54:49-4.1, a business organization that fails to provide a copy of a business registration as required, or that provides false business registration information, shall be liable for a penalty of \$25.00 for each day of violation, not to exceed \$50,000, for each proof of business registration not properly provided under a contract with a contracting agency.

Emergency Purchases or Contracts

For purchases of an emergent nature, the contractor shall provide its Business Registration Certificate within two weeks from the date of purchase or execution of the contract or prior to payment for goods or services, whichever is earlier.

2.8.7 "Pay to Play" – Notice of Disclosure Requirement

Business entities are advised of their responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement of political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC) pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.27 if they receive contracts in excess of \$50,000 from public entities in a calendar year. Business entities are responsible for determining if filing is necessary. Additional information on this requirement is available from ELEC at 888-313-3532 or at www.elec.state.nj.us.

2.8.8 Assign, Sublet or Transfer Any Rights/Interests

Neither the owner nor the Contractor shall assign, sublet, or transfer any rights or interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless specifically stated to the contrary, in writing, prior to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the owner and the Contractor.

2.8.9 Insurance and Indemnification

If it becomes necessary for the contractor, either as principal or by agent or employee, to enter upon the premises or property of the owner in order to construct, erect, inspect, make delivery or remove property hereunder, the contractor hereby covenants and agrees to take use, provide and make all proper, necessary and sufficient precautions, safeguards, and protection against the occurrence of happenings of any accident, injuries, damages, or hurt to person or property during the course of the work herein covered and be his/her sole responsibility.

The contractor shall maintain sufficient insurance to protect against all claims under Workers Compensation, General Liability and Automobile and shall be subject to approval for adequacy of protection and certificates of such insurance shall be provided.

Indemnification

The contractor agrees to indemnify and save harmless the owner, its officers, agents and employees, hereinafter referred to as indemnitees, from all suits, including attorney's fees and costs of litigation, actions, loss damage, expense, cost of claims, of any character or on account of any act, claim or amount arising or recovered under Worker's Compensation law, or arising out of failure of the Contractor or those acting under Contractor to conform to any statutes, ordinances, regulations, law or court decree. It is the intent of the parties to this contract that the indemnities shall, in all instances, except for loss or damage resulting from the sole negligence of the indemnitee, be indemnified against all liability, loss or damage of any nature whatsoever.

Insurance Requirements:

Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance

This insurance shall be maintained in full force during the life of this contract by the contractor covering all employees engaged in performance of this contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:15-12(a) and N.J.A.C. 12:235-1.6. Minimum Employer's Liability \$1,000,000.00.

General Liability Insurance

This insurance shall have limits of not less than \$3,000,000.00 any one person and \$3,000,000.00 any one accident for bodily injury and \$3,000,000.00 aggregate for property damage, and shall be maintained in force during the life of the contract.

Automobile Liability Insurance

This insurance covering contractor for claims arising from owned, hired and non-owned vehicles with limits of not less than \$3,000,000.00 any one person and \$3,000,000.00 any one accident for bodily injury and \$3,000,000.00 each accident for property damage, shall be maintained in force during the life of this contract by the contractor.

Professional Liability/Malpractice Insurance Policy (if applicable)

Coverage in the amount of \$2,000,000.00/occurrence, \$4,000,000.00 aggregate and assurance that each such policy for each staff member remains full and in effect while providing services for owner.

The contractor shall provide the owner with a Certificate of Insurance naming the County of Somerset as additionally insured, evidencing the existence of required insurance prior to the commission of work. Said insurance must include coverage for complete operations, contractual insurance and independent contractor or subcontractor insurance, where and if applicable.

Errors and Omissions Insurance

- A. The contractor shall purchase and maintain during the entire period of this contract, errors and omissions insurance that shall protect the contractor and the County from any and all claims that may arise out of or result from the contractor's performance of this contract. Specifically, the errors and omissions insurance shall have limits of not less than \$2,000,000.00 dollars per occurrence and \$4,000,000.00 dollars in the aggregate.
- B. Certificates of the Required Insurance

Certificates as listed above shall be submitted along with the contract as evidence covering Errors and Omissions insurance. Such coverage shall be with acceptable insurance companies operating on an admitted basis in the State of New Jersey.

The contractor shall provide the Somerset County Park Commission with a Certificate of Insurance naming the County, its employees, officers, and agents as additionally insured, and evidencing the existence of required insurance prior to the commission of work.

Somerset County Park Commission will not accept Mutual Limitation of Liability terms.

2.8.10 Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 - HIPAA (If Applicable)

Both parties agree to comply with all requirements of the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") as maybe amended from time to time, and the corresponding HIPAA regulations for the confidentiality and security of medical information.

The Contractor shall:

- Not use or disclose protected health information other than as permitted or required by law
- Use appropriate safeguards to protect the confidentiality of the information
- Report any use or disclosure not permitted

The contractor, by execution of the contract, shall thereby indemnify and hold the owner harmless from any and all liabilities, claims, actions, costs and penalties which may be incurred as the result of the failure of the contractor to comply with the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) or any other statute or case law protecting the privacy of persons using its services.

2.8.11 Proof of Licensure

Proof of licensure for providing Services in the State of New Jersey, for either the firm or the person responsible for the work, shall be provided as required.

2.8.12 Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran – P.L. 2012, c. 25

P.L. 2012, c.25 prohibits State and local public contracts with persons or entities engaging in certain investment activities in energy or finance sectors of Iran.

2.9 Public Emergency

In the event of a Public Emergency declared at the Local, State or Federal Level, if the owner opts to extend terms and conditions of this RFP, the contractor agrees to extend the terms and conditions of this RFP, whether existing, expiring or expired no longer than six months, for goods and/or services for the duration of the emergency. In the event the original contractor cannot meet this requirement, the owner may solicit the goods and/or services from any bidder on this contract.

2.10 Multiple Proposals Not Accepted

More than one proposal from an individual, a firm or partnership, a corporation or association under the same or different names shall not be considered.

2.11 Subcontractors

The owner will consider the primary contractor to be the sole point of contact with regard to contract matters. The primary contractor will be required to assume sole responsibility for delivery of all services.

2.11.1 Use of Sub-consultants

Respondent may find it advantageous to include sub-consultants in their proposal. Such an arrangement is acceptable provided that the relationship between firms is clearly defined and the method of maintaining proper project management and oversight is described within the proposal. The use of sub-consultants is left to the discretion of respondent, provided that the criteria of adequate capability in all areas of the scope of work is met. Any sub-consultants must be identified in the same manner as the primary consultant.

2.12 Failure to Enter Contract

Should the respondent, to whom the contract is awarded, fail to enter into a contract within ten (10) days, Sundays and holidays excepted, the owner may then, at its option, accept the proposal of another respondent.

2.13 Commencement of Work

The contractor agrees to commence work after the date of award by the owner and upon notice from the using department.

2.14 Time of Completion

It is hereby understood and mutually agreed, by and between the respondent and the owner, that the date on which the work shall be substantially complete as specified in the RFP is an essential condition of this contract. It is further mutually understood and agreed that the work and contract time embraced in this Contract shall commence on the date specified and that the resulting contract shall be completed in sequence and time frames identified by the owner.

The respondent agrees that said services shall be processed regularly, diligently, and uninterruptedly at such rate of progress as will insure full completion thereof within the time specified. It is expressly understood and agreed, by and between the respondent and the owner, that the time of completion of the services described herein is a reasonable time for the completion of it.

2.15 Termination of Contract

If, through any cause, the contractor shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner obligations under the Contract or if the contractor violates any requirements of the Contract, the owner shall thereupon have the right to terminate the Contract by giving written notice to the contractor of such termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed effective date

of the termination. Such termination shall relieve the owner of any obligation for the balances to the contractor of any sum or sums set forth in the Contract.

The contractor agrees to indemnify and hold the owner harmless from any liability to subcontractors/suppliers concerning payment for work performed or goods supplied arising out of the lawful termination of the Contract by the owner under this provision.

In case of default by the contractor, the owner may procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.

2.16 Non-Allocation of Funding Termination

Each fiscal year payment obligation of the Owner is conditioned upon the availability of Owner funds appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of any services performed by the Contractor hereunder, whether in whole or in part, the Owner at the end of any particular fiscal year may terminate such services. The Owner will notify the Contractor in writing immediately of any services that will be affected by a shortage of appropriated funds. This provision shall not be construed so as to permit the Owner to terminate this Agreement during the term, or any service hereunder, merely in order to acquire identical services from a third party contractor.

2.17 Force Majeure

Neither party shall be responsible for any resulting loss or obligation to fulfill duties as specified in any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement if the fulfillment of any term or provision of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any revolutions, insurrections, riots, wars, acts of enemies, national emergencies, strikes, floods, fires, acts of God, or by any cause not within the control of the party whose performance is interfered with which by the exercise of reasonable diligence such party is unable to prevent. Additionally, if the fulfillment of any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any court order, or action or injunction or other such agreement, this Agreement shall become voidable by the Somerset County Park Commission by notice to each party.

- **2.18** The owner and the Contractor each bind themselves and their successors, executors, administrators, heirs and assigns and legal representatives of the other party respecting all covenants and agreements and obligations of this contract.
- **2.19** The terms of this contract shall be construed and interpreted, and all respective rights and duties of the parties shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

2.20 Challenge of Specifications

Any respondent who wishes to challenge a specification shall file such challenge in writing with the Purchasing Agent no less than three (3) business days prior to the opening of the RFP's.

Challenges filed after that time shall be considered void and having no impact on the owner or the award of contract.

2.21 Payment

Invoices shall be submitted monthly and must specify, in detail, the period for which payment is claimed, the services performed during the prescribed period, the amount claimed and correlation between the services claimed, all backup documentation (mileage, time logs, receipts for expenses, etc.), amount remaining in total balance, and the Proposal Cost Form.

Somerset County Park Commission will provide a sample Progress Report and Invoice for the Hired Consultant to ensure compliance.

The owner may withhold all or partial payments on account of subsequently discovered evidence including but not limited to the following:

- 1 Deliverables not complying with the project specification;
- 2 Claims filed or responsible evidence indicating probability of filing claims;
- 3 A reasonable doubt that the Contract can be completed for the balance then unpaid.

When the above grounds are removed, payment shall be made for amounts withheld because of them.

Invoices shall specify, in detail, the period for which payment is claimed, the services performed during the prescribed period, the amount claimed and correlation between the services claimed and the Proposal Cost Form.

2.22 Non-payment of Penalties and Interest on Overdue Bills

Public funds may be used to pay only for goods delivered or services rendered. Somerset County Park Commission will not pay penalties and/or interest on overdue bills. No employee is authorized to sign a letter of credit or any other document that represents a legal commitment on the part of the Somerset County Park Commission to pay additional fees.

2.23 Ownership of Material

The owner shall retain all of its rights and interest in any and all documents and property both hard copy and digital furnished by the owner to the contractor for the purpose of assisting the contractor in the performance of this contract. All such items shall be returned immediately to the owner at the expiration or termination of the contract or completion of any related services, pursuant thereto, whichever comes first. None of the documents and/or property shall, without the written consent of the owner, be disclosed to others or used by the contractor or permitted by the contractor to be used by their parties at any time except in the performance of the resulting contract.

Ownership of all data, materials and documentation originated and prepared for the owner pursuant to this contract shall belong exclusively to the owner. All data, reports, computerized information, programs and materials related to this project shall be delivered to and become the property of the owner upon completion of the project. The contractor shall not have the right to use, sell, or disclose the total of the interim or final work products, or make available to third parties, without the prior written consent of the owner. All information supplied to the owner may be required to be supplied on CD-ROM/USB flash drive media compatible with the owner's computer operating system windows based, Microsoft Office 2010.

Under state and federal statutes, certain government records are protected from public disclosure. The Somerset County Park Commission, the Contractor and any Subcontractors have a responsibility and an obligation to safeguard from public access an employee's personal information with which it has been entrusted when disclosure thereof would violate the employee's reasonable expectation of privacy. All payroll, personnel and health insurance related files are confidential. Additionally the Contractor and any Subcontractors may be privy to sensitive law enforcement information or investigations during their review which must remain confidential. The Somerset County Park Commission reserves the right to make any public disclosure under the law. Also among government records deemed confidential are administrative or technical information regarding computer hardware, software and networks that, if disclosed, would jeopardize computer security. The Contractor and any Subcontractor(s) are prohibited from the sale or distribution of all supplied information to any third party.

2.24 Source of Specifications/RFP Packages

Official Somerset County Park Commission Request for Proposal (RFP) packages for routine goods and services are available on the County's and Somerset County Park Commission websites at <u>www.co.somerset.nj.us</u> and <u>www.somersetcountyparks.org</u> at no cost to the prospective respondents. All addenda are posted on both site's and issued in accordance with

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23(c)(1). Potential bidders are cautioned that they are bidding at their own risk if a third party supplied the specifications that may or may not be complete. The Somerset County Park Commission is not responsible for third party supplied specifications.

3. Scope of Work (SOW)

Respondents have the option to respond to one or more of the services.

Respondents must submit a Statement of Qualifications and a minimum of three references for each service for which they are responding.

3.1 Description of Lord Stirling Stable

Lord Stirling Stable, located at 256 South Maple Avenue in the Basking Ridge section of Bernards Township is a recreational equestrian facility offering instruction in English and western horsemanship for youth and adults from beginner through over fences. There are approximately 70 horses and 10 ponies. Special events and horse shows are also conducted. There are more than 14 miles of trails, and horses are available to rent for trail rides.

All vendors shall provide in a timely manner, a monthly itemized bill which shall include the date of work and services rendered as it pertains to each individual horse.

3.2 <u>Farrier</u>

The Farrier must have a minimum of five years professional experience in proper trimming techniques, and the sizing, shaping, and application of various types of shoes, so as not to cause harm to the horse/pony. The Farrier must have attended and successfully completed a recognized farrier school or taken and successfully passed a recognized farrier course through an accredited educational institute and be certified through the American Farriers Association. Proof of passing of exams (written and practical) and official certification of such must be provided with the proposal response. The Farrier must be able to recognize soundness issues related to the horse's foot (i.e. abscesses, thrush, corns, contracted heels, Navicular, etc.) and their treatment as related to shoeing, trimming, and foot care.

The Farrier must have his/her own equipment to perform the necessary services, and must be able to supply the various types of shoes, pads, and other supplies required for proper hot shoeing. The Farrier must be available a minimum of two weekday **mornings** per week for routine shoeing, trimming, and hoof care. It is necessary that work be started no earlier than 8am and completed no later than 4pm to coordinate with the Stable's lesson schedule. Farrier services cannot be provided on Wednesday, Saturday, Sunday, or closed Holidays unless there is an emergency as defined by the Stable. The Farrier must be willing to come to the Stable on

short notice when possible to replace a lost shoe, and agreeable when necessary to adjust work schedule as requested during scheduled lesson session breaks.

The Farrier must be willing to work in conjunction with the veterinarian and Somerset County Park Commission staff as required. In keeping with accepted industry practice, each horse/pony is routinely trimmed/shod every four to eight weeks. The Farrier must understand that each horse has unique requirements, and be willing to shoe/trim all horses/ponies housed on site. Excessive loss of shoes due to improper attachment, and shoeing-related lamenesses such as, but not limited to, "hot nails," is unacceptable. Stable staff will be available to hold horses that will not tie or stand quietly for shoeing, however, these horses must be trimmed/shod prior to 1:00pm based on staff shift schedules.

Apprentices/Journeymen are not permitted without prior approval of the Stable Manager. All work done by the Apprentice/Journeyman must be directly supervised by the contracted Farrier. An Apprentice/Journeyman may not be sent on his/her own to perform shoeing/trimming duties.

3.2 Equine Dentist

The Equine Dentist must have a minimum of five years professional experience in performing scheduled oral exams and emergency oral care. An oral exam and any required dental work including, but not limited to floating and tooth extraction is performed on each horse annually. Sedation is to be used as necessary.

The Equine Dentist must: be either a veterinarian licensed to practice in New Jersey or a person specializing in Equine Dentistry acting under the direct supervision of a veterinarian licensed to practice in New Jersey in accordance with NJ ST 45:16-9.7. The Equine Dentist must be licensed to administer sedation to the horse or work with a licensed veterinarian responsible for the sedation.

If the Equine Dentist is not a veterinarian licensed to practice in New Jersey, the Equine Dentist must supply the name of the supervising veterinarian with the proposal. It is the responsibility of the Equine Dentist to provide all remuneration for the supervising licensed veterinarian. The licensed veterinarian must submit proof of a valid New Jersey Veterinary license, and must all submit all statutory documentation required with this proposal. Dental Interns are not permitted without prior approval of the Stable Manager.

The Equine Dentist is needed to perform on each horse on a yearly basis routine dental maintenance including but not limited to an exam, floating of hooks, waves, ramps, steps, ridges, reduction, incisor realignment, tartar removal, flushing of pockets, and bit seat. In extreme cases, some horses may need bi-annual exams. The Equine Dentist must be able and willing to work in conjunction with the contracted veterinarian and Somerset County Park Commission staff as necessary. The Equine Dentist must be willing to treat all horses/ponies housed on the site, and must be available to handle emergency visits in a timely manner.

The Stable will schedule yearly appointments a minimum of six-months in advance. The Stable will provide an experienced handler to assist the Equine Dentist in the restraint of the horses during the exam and any procedures. Should Stable staff be unavailable, the Equine Dentist may provide a qualified handler and charge the Stable for the handler's time as specified in the service rate quotes.

Each Equine Dentistry proposal must define what is included in a scheduled routine dental exam, the average time needed per exam, the type of sedation used, and a general estimate of the cost of the exam so that the information may be used for a comparison basis and general evaluation purposes.

3.3 Veterinarian

The Equine Veterinarian or Veterinary group must be licensed to practice in the State of New Jersey, have a minimum of five years professional practice experience, and provide proof with their response. Sole practicing Veterinarians must provide the name(s) of any covering Veterinarians/Practices to be used when their service is not available. Covering Veterinarians/Practices must submit all statutory documentation required with this proposal and meet the minimum requirements of professional experience. The Equine Veterinarian shall be available 24/7 for emergency calls to treat colic, wounds that require immediate suturing, and all other medical needs that require prompt attention. The Veterinarian must be available to perform lameness checks and other routine medical services as necessary. Lameness checks and other routine medical services as necessary. Additional visits will be scheduled as necessary. When not available, the sole Equine Veterinarian shall arrange coverage from another Equine Veterinarian/Group licensed to practice in the State of New Jersey. Interns must be under the supervision of the primary Veterinarian.

All horses receive Tetanus, Encephalitis, Potomac Fever, Botulism, West Nile Virus, Leptospirosis, and Rabies vaccinations supplied and administered by the Veterinarian once a year. Encephalitis, West Nile Virus, Potomac Fever, Rhinopneumonitis and Influenza vaccinations are given twice a year. The veterinarian must be able to draw blood and submit sample(s) to the State lab for Coggins test(s) as necessary.

All horses/ponies are de-wormed on a regular schedule determined by the Veterinarian based on industry research recommendations and/or fecal egg count analysis. The de-worming medication may be supplied by the Veterinarian or by the Park Commission, at the Park Commission's discretion.

Pharmaceuticals including but not limited to Phenylbutazone, Isoxuprine Hydrochloride, Trimethoprim Sulfamethoxazole, Antibiotics, Dexamethasone, Flunixin Meglumine, Pergolide, Pentosan, Adequan, and other medicinal drugs as prescribed must be available by prescription to be obtained by the Park Commission or in stock and/or supplied by the Veterinarian on each visit as necessary.

Newly donated or purchased horses may require a thorough health and soundness examination performed by the Veterinarian. The exam will consist of – inspection of any breed registration papers and Coggins test for accuracy; determination of the horse's age by dental nomenclature; listening to lungs and heart; inspection of the eyes; and an overall conformation and soundness evaluation to determine if the horse is suitable to be utilized in the Lord Stirling Stable riding program. Horses no longer suitable for lessons may require a general retirement exam, with a report issued to the Somerset County Park Commission outlining the horse's medical condition and usability before being accepted into the School Horse Retirement program.

The Veterinarian must be able and willing to work in conjunction with the Farrier, Equine Dentist, and Somerset County Park Commission staff as necessary. The Veterinarian must be willing to treat all horses/ponies housed on the site.

Veterinarian must submit a copy of their New Jersey Veterinary License along with their proposal.

5. Evaluation, Review and Selection Process

5.1 Proposals to Remain Subject to Acceptance

RFP responses shall remain open for a period of sixty (60) calendar days from the stated submittal. The owner will either award the Contract within the applicable time period or reject all proposals.

The owner may extend the decision to award or reject all proposals beyond the sixty (60) calendar days when the proposals of any respondents who consent thereto may, at the request of the owner, be held for consideration for such longer period as may be agreed.

5.2 Rejection of Proposals

The owner reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, or to reject any proposals if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of such respondent fails to satisfy the owner that such respondent is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the RFP and to complete the work contemplated therein. The owner reserves the right to waive any minor informality in the RFP.

5.3 Evaluation Process

An evaluation team will review all proposals to determine if they satisfy the Proposal Requirements, determine if a proposal should be rejected and evaluate the proposals based upon the Evaluation Criteria. The highest-ranking respondent will then be recommended to the governing body for award of contract, based on most advantageous price and other factors. The Somerset County Park Commission reserves the right to reach out to the respondents to get clarification on Proposals on specific items if necessary during the deliberation process.

Evaluation Team – RFP respondents are prohibited from contacting any member of the evaluation team directly without a formal invitation. If it is found that a respondent has attempted to discuss their proposal with a team member without an invite then their proposal may be deemed unresponsive. All questions during the evaluation period shall be directed to the Purchasing Agent.

5.4 Evaluation Criteria

The criteria considered in the evaluation of each proposal follows. The arrangement of the criteria is not meant to imply order of importance in the selection process. All criteria will be used to select the successful respondent.

This will be based on the quality of the content of the RFP and the respondent's ability to communicate a thorough understanding of the required tasks and the approach to meet the scope of work outlined in the RFP. The proposals will be evaluated for general compliance with instructions and requests issued in the RFP. Non-compliance with significant instructions will be grounds for disqualification of proposals.

5.4.1 Understanding of the Requested Work

The proposals will be evaluated for general compliance with instructions and requests issued in the RFP. Non-compliance with significant instructions shall be grounds for disqualification of proposals.

5.4.2 Knowledge and Technical Competence

This includes the ability of the respondent to perform all of the tasks and fulfill adequately the stated requirements.

5.4.3 Management, Experience and Personnel Qualifications

Expertise of the firm shall be demonstrated by past contract successes providing government agencies with similar services. The respondent will be evaluated on knowledge, experience, prior collaboration and successful completion of projects/services similar to that requested in this RFPQ. In addition to relevant experience, respondents shall provide personnel qualifications in the Proposal. (See 4.1 and 4.2).

5.4.4 Ability to Complete the Project/Services in a Timely Manner

This is based on the estimated duration of the tasks and the respondent's ability to accomplish these tasks as stated.

5.4.5 Cost

Price shall be based on unit pricing submitted with the proposal. Any services not included as part of any resulting contract scope of services must be approved and authorized by the owner before such work is initiated. The owner shall pay for such approved services, at the rate or cost agreed upon between the owner and contractor, provided the respondent has provided a schedule of fees for additional services with this RFP.

5.5 Payment

Invoices shall be submitted monthly and must specify, in detail, the period for which payment is claimed, the services performed during the prescribed period, the amount claimed and correlation between the services claimed, all backup documentation (mileage, time logs, receipts for expenses, etc.), amount remaining in total balance, and the Proposal Cost Form.

The owner may withhold all or partial payments on account of subsequently discovered evidence including but not limited to the following:

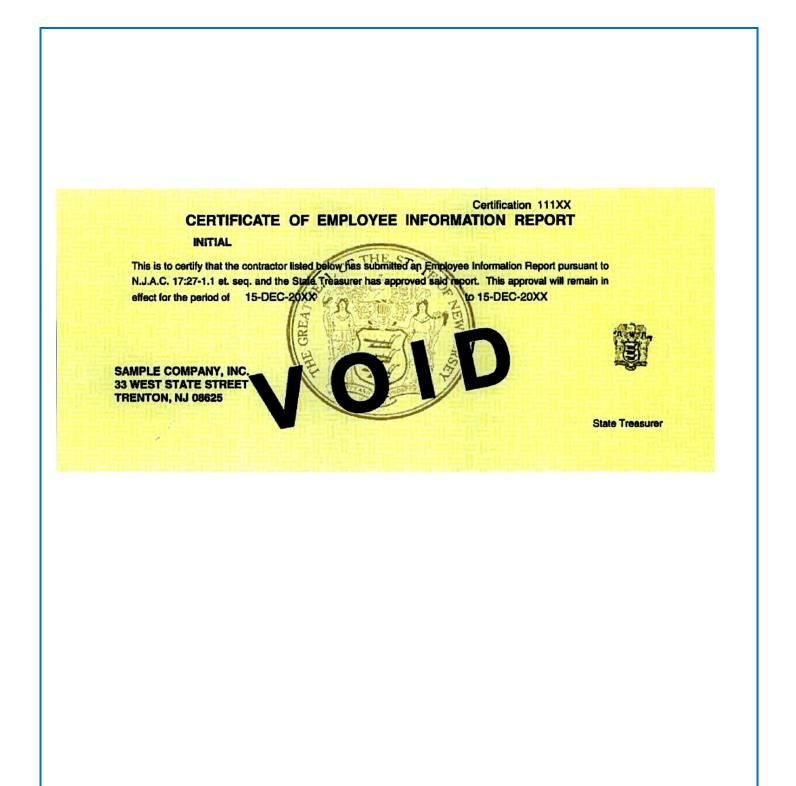
