FINANCE

Commissioner Caliguire, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for the month of November 2023.

HUMAN RESOURCES

Commissioner Hayes, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for the month of November 2023.

LEISURE SERVICES

Commissioner Foelsch, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for the month of November 2023.

Stephen Dahl, Manager of Recreation and Therapeutic Recreation, shared that the TR department hosted their Sensitive Santa event for families with special needs family members and 28 families participated out of a possible 33 families. He also wanted to thank the Somerset County Park Foundation for a donation of \$1,900 for photography services and a train at the Sensitive Santa event. He also mentioned that a Hand Chimes Choir will be playing at the Festival of Trees at the Environmental Education Center this Saturday, December 16, 2023.

Carrie Springer, Administrator of Leisure and Community Services, reported that visitation at Buck Garden increased by 70% over the prior year mainly attributed to a viral social media video that sparked interest from the public earlier this year. Colonial Park Horticulture hosted a successful "Kissing Ball" event at Headquarters last weekend. The Stables at Lord Striling Park had a successful Toys for Tots drive with Santa pictures despite the bad weather. This Saturday and Sunday, the Stables will be hosting "S'mores with Santa" events. The Environmental Education Center will be holding its annual Festival of Trees event until December 28th. Carrie also offered her thanks to Doug Vornlocker for helping to conduct a deer density survey at Lord Stirling Park which will provide good information for their deer management program.

Commissioner Foelsch added that the staff trees at the Environmental Education Center are creative and that he recommends a visit to see the trees on display.

GOLF MANAGEMENT

Commissioner McCallen, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for the month of November 2023.

Manager of Golf Operations, Ken Fivek, said that this Sunday will be the last day that Green Knoll Golf Course will be open for the season. The three remaining courses, Neshanic Valley, Spooky Brook, and Quail Brook, will remain open year-round. He shared that 246,000 rounds were played as of the end of November 2023, and that is 15,000 more than rounds played in 2022. The amount of rounds played in 2022 had also been a new record.

Darrell Marcinek, Director of Golf Maintenance, provided an update that the irrigation replacement project at Warrenbrook Golf Course is underway, that the work on the replacement of three bridges at Green Knoll Golf Course was underway, and that some paving has recently been done at the golf courses. He offered his thanks to the engineering department for leading these projects.

INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

Commissioner Kempe, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for the month of November 2023.

VISITOR SERVICES

Commissioner Foelsch, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for the month of November 2023.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

Commissioner D'Andrea, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for November 2023.

Doug Vornlocker, Manager of Park Rangers and Property Management shared that the riparian buffer project funded by a \$10,000 grant from New Jersey American Water was completed and the project received some positive news coverage with WPIX Channel 11 which included coverage related to the girl scouts troop who helped with the tree planting.

Doug also shared that 2023 was a record-breaking year for Park Ranger Volunteer Programs. There was an increase from 250 to 332 total volunteers and 1,015 volunteer hours were recorded. 14 corporate workdays were also conducted with 12 organizations as well. Community workdays were attended by a total of 111 individuals, an increase of about 40 people for 2023. The Volunteer Stewardship program is expected to expand in 2024 with an increase in the ways that rangers can utilize volunteers and more flexibility for volunteers to work outside of scheduled workdays.

PLANNING AND LAND ACQUISITION

Commissioner Jones, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for November 2023.

Tom Boccino, Park Commission Principal Planner/Land Acquisition, said that a photo op and press release are out for the first, newly designed Open Space signs. These new signs are designed to help raise awareness of acquired open space throughout Somerset County.

CAPITAL FACILITIES – CONSTRUCTION AND ENGINEERING

Commissioner McCallen, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for November 2023.

Adam Bloom, Park Commission Engineer, provided an update on his engineering report. The horse barn at Lord Stirling Park received lots of bids and he expects that project to be awarded in January 2024. He expects the bid for the pickleball courts at North Branch Park to be opened on February 8th.

PARK MAINTENANCE & HORTICULTURE

Commissioner Kempe, Chair of the Committee, submitted a report for November 2023.
