Ben Barkley, Environmental Education Center Naturalist, entered with his friends as a competitive team. The goal was to identify as many species of birds as possible in the State of New Jersey within a 24-hour period. They found 197 species and won the cup. It was the first time a competitive World Series Birding team visited a Somerset County Park during the event.

Stephen Dahl, Manager of Recreation and Therapeutic Recreation, reported that Therapeutic Recreation will have registration for their Summer Connect program begin this coming Monday. They will be doing four weeks of hybrid travel and will also have some programming at Headquarters.
