1. Introduction

The Somerset County Park Commission is requesting proposals from qualified contractors for delivery, installation and service for an all-in-one golf course management system that includes a customer database, web-based tee sheet, tee time reservation system, and point of sale (POS) services at six (6) golf course locations in Somerset County.

2. Administrative Conditions and Requirements

The following items express the conditions and requirements of this RFP. Together with the other RFP sections, they apply to the RFP process, the subsequent contract, and project production. Any proposed change, modification, or exception to these conditions and requirements may be the basis for the owner to determine the proposal as non-responsive to the RFP and will be a factor in the determination of an award of a contract. The contents of the proposal of the successful respondent, as accepted by the owner, will become part of any contract awarded as a result of this RFP.

2.5 Interpretations and Addenda

- A. The respondent understands and agrees that its proposal is submitted on the basis of the specifications prepared by the County. The respondent accepts the obligation to become familiar with these specifications.
- B. Respondents are expected to examine the specifications and related documents with care and observe all their requirements. Ambiguities, errors or omissions noted by respondent should be promptly reported in writing to the Purchasing Agent. In the event the respondent fails to notify the County of such ambiguities, errors or omissions, the respondent shall be bound by the proposal.
- C. No oral interpretation of the meaning of the specifications will be made to any potential respondent. Every request for an interpretation shall be in writing, addressed to the Purchasing Agent, referencing the Contract Name and Contract Number in the subject line, at PurchasingDiv@co.somerset.nj.us. In order to be given consideration, written requests for interpretation and or clarification must be received at last three (3) business days prior to the date fixed for the opening of the proposals.
- D. All interpretations, clarifications and any supplemental instructions will be in the form of written addenda to the specifications, and will be distributed to all prospective bidders. All addenda so issued shall become part of the specification and RFP documents, and shall be acknowledged by the respondent by completing the Acknowledgement of Receipt of Addenda form. The County's interpretations or corrections thereof shall be final.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23(c)(1) when issuing addenda, the owner shall provide required notice prior to official receipt of proposals to any person who has submitted a response or who has received a RFP package. They will be sent via electronic transmissions to those known recipients of the RFP specifications.

- E. Discrepancies in RFP's
1. If the amount shown in words and its equivalent figures do not agree, the written words shall be binding. Ditto marks are not considered writing or printing and shall not be used.
 2. In the event that there is a discrepancy between the unit prices and the extended totals, the unit price shall prevail. In the event there is an error of the summation of the extended totals, the computation by the County of the extended totals shall govern.

2.6 Quantities of Estimate

Wherever the estimated quantities of work to be done are shown in any section of this RFP, including the Proposal Cost Form, they are given for use in comparing proposals. The owner especially reserves the right (except as herein otherwise specifically limited) to increase or diminish the quantities as may be deemed reasonably necessary or desirable by the owner to complete the work detailed by the contract. Such increase or diminution shall in no way violate this contract, nor shall any such increase or diminution give cause for claims or liability for damages.

2.7 Cost Liability and Additional Costs

The owner assumes no responsibility and liability for costs incurred by the Respondents prior to the issuance of an agreement. The liability of the owner shall be limited to the terms and conditions of the contract.

Respondents will assume responsibility for all costs not stated in their proposals. All unit rates either stated in the proposal or used as a basis for its pricing are required to be all-inclusive. Additional charges, unless incurred for additional work performed by request of the owner as noted in 2.6, are not to be billed and will not be paid.

2.8 Statutory and Other Requirements

2.8.1 Compliance with Laws

Any contract entered into between the contractor and the owner must be in accordance with and subject to compliance by both parties with the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law. The contractor must agree to comply with the non-discrimination provisions and all other laws and regulations applicable to the performance of services there under. The respondent shall sign and acknowledge such forms and certificates as may be required by this section.

2.8.2 MANDATORY EEO/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION EVIDENCE – N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17-27 et seq.

No firm may be issued a contract unless it complies with the affirmative action provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27-1 et seq. as administered by the Division of Purchase & Property Contract Compliance and Audit Unit (Division) and provided below. The contract will include the language included as attachment A in this specification.

1. Goods, Professional Services and Service Contracts

Each contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

- i. A Letter of Federal Approval indicating that the vendor is under an existing federally approved or sanctioned affirmative action program. A copy of the letter must be provided by the vendor to the Public Agency and Division. This approval letter is valid for one year from the date of issuance.
- ii. A Certificate of Employee Information Report (hereafter "Certificate"), issued in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27 et seq. The vendor must provide a copy of the Certificate to the Public Agency as evidence of its compliance with the regulations. The

Certificate represents the review and approval of the vendor's Employee Information Report, Form AA-302 by the Division

- iii. The successful respondent shall complete an Initial Employee Report, Form AA-302 and submit it to the Division with a check or money order for \$150.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of New Jersey" www.state.nj.us/treasury/contract_compliance

The form shall be properly executed.

2.8.3 New Jersey Anti-Discrimination – N.J.S.A. 10:2-1

There shall be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work required to produce the goods and services covered by any contract resulting from this bid, or against any applicant to such employment because of race, religion, sex, national origin, creed, color, ancestry, age, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, familial status, liability for service in the Armed Forces of the United States, or nationality. This provision shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment upgrading, demotion, transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor shall insert a similar provision in all subcontracts for services to be covered by any contract resulting from this RFP.

2.8.4 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 - 42 U.S.C. S121 01 et seq.

Discrimination on the basis of disability in contracting for the delivery of services is prohibited. Respondents are required to read American with Disabilities language that is part of the documents attached hereto and agree that the provisions of Title II of the Act are made part of the contract. The contractor is obligated to comply with the Act and hold the owner harmless.

2.8.5 Ownership Disclosure - N.J.S.A. 52:25-24.2 (P.L. 1977 c.33)

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:25-24.2, no corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability corporation, limited liability partnership, Subchapter S corporation or sole proprietorship, shall be awarded a contract, unless prior to the receipt of the RFP response/bid or accompanying the RFP response/bid of the corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability corporation, limited liability partnership, subchapter S corporation or sole proprietorship, there is submitted to the County a statement setting forth the names and addresses of all stockholders who own 10% or more of the stock, of any class or of all individual partners who own a 10% or greater interest in the corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability corporation, limited liability partnership, Subchapter S corporation or sole proprietorship. If one or more such stockholder or partner is itself a corporation or partnership, the stockholders holding 10% or more of that corporation's stock, or the individual partners owning 10% or greater interest in that partnership, as the case may be, shall also be listed. The disclosure shall be continued until names and addresses of every non-corporate stockholder and individual partner, exceeding the 10% ownership criteria established in this act has been listed. The form shall be signed and submitted with the RFP proposal/bid whether or not a stockholder or partner owns less than 10% of the business submitting the RFP proposal/bid. Failure to comply requires mandatory rejection of the RFP proposal/bid. The Respondent shall complete and submit the form of statement that is included in this RFP.

2.8.6 Non-Collusion Affidavit - N.J.S.A. 52:34-15

The Non-Collusion Affidavit, which is part of this RFP, shall be properly executed and submitted with the RFP response.

2.8.7 Proof of N.J. Business Registration Certificate - N.J.S.A. 52:32-44

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-44, Somerset County ("Contracting Agency") is prohibited from entering into a contract with an entity unless the bidder/proposer/contractor, and each subcontractor that is required by law to be named in a bid/proposal/contract has a valid

Business Registration Certificate on file with the Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services within the Department of the Treasury.

Prior to contract award or authorization, the contractor shall provide the Contracting Agency with its proof of business registration and that of any named subcontractor(s).

Subcontractors named in a bid or proposal shall provide proof of business registration to the bidder, who in turn, shall provide it to the Contracting Agency prior to the time of contract, purchase order, or other contracting document is awarded or authorized.

During the course of contract performance:

- (1) The contractor shall not enter into a contract with a subcontractor unless the subcontractor first provides the contractor with a valid proof of business registration.
- (2) The contractor shall maintain and submit to the Contracting Agency a list of subcontractors and their addresses that may be updated from time to time.
- (3) The contractor and any subcontractor providing goods or performing services under the contract, and each of their affiliates, shall collect and remit to the Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of Treasury, the use tax due pursuant to the Sales and Use Tax Act, (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq.) on all sales of tangible personal property delivered in the State. Any questions in this regard can be directed to the Division of Taxation at (609) 292-6400. Form NJ-REG can be filed online at www.state.nj.us/treasury/revenue/busregcert.shtml.

Before final payment is made under the contract, the contractor shall submit to the Contracting Agency a complete and accurate list of all subcontractors used and their addresses.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:49-4.1, a business organization that fails to provide a copy of a business registration as required, or that provides false business registration information, shall be liable for a penalty of \$25.00 for each day of violation, not to exceed \$50,000, for each proof of business registration not properly provided under a contract with a contracting agency.

Emergency Purchases or Contracts

For purchases of an emergent nature, the contractor shall provide its Business Registration Certificate within two weeks from the date of purchase or execution of the contract or prior to payment for goods or services, whichever is earlier.

2.8.8 "Pay to Play" – Notice of Disclosure Requirement

Business entities are advised of their responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement of political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC) pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.27 if they receive contracts in excess of \$50,000 from public entities in a calendar year. Business entities are responsible for determining if filing is necessary. Additional information on this requirement is available from ELEC at 888-313-3532 or at www.elec.state.nj.us.

2.8.9 Assign, Sublet or Transfer Any Rights/Interests

Neither the owner nor the Contractor shall assign, sublet, or transfer any rights or interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless specifically stated to the contrary, in writing, prior to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the owner and the Contractor.

2.8.10 Insurance and Indemnification

If it becomes necessary for the contractor, either as principal or by agent or employee, to enter upon the premises or property of the owner in order to construct, erect, inspect, make delivery

or remove property hereunder, the contractor hereby covenants and agrees to take use, provide and make all proper, necessary and sufficient precautions, safeguards, and protection against the occurrence of happenings of any accident, injuries, damages, or hurt to person or property during the course of the work herein covered and be his/her sole responsibility.

The contractor shall maintain sufficient insurance to protect against all claims under Workers Compensation, General Liability and Automobile and shall be subject to approval for adequacy of protection and certificates of such insurance shall be provided.

Indemnification

The contractor agrees to indemnify and save harmless the owner, its officers, agents and employees, hereinafter referred to as indemnitees, from all suits, including attorney's fees and costs of litigation, actions, loss damage, expense, cost of claims, of any character or on account of any act, claim or amount arising or recovered under Worker's Compensation law, or arising out of failure of the Contractor or those acting under Contractor to conform to any statutes, ordinances, regulations, law or court decree. It is the intent of the parties to this contract that the indemnities shall, in all instances, except for loss or damage resulting from the sole negligence of the indemnitee, be indemnified against all liability, loss or damage of any nature whatsoever.

Insurance Requirements:

Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance

This insurance shall be maintained in full force during the life of this contract by the contractor covering all employees engaged in performance of this contract pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:15- 12(a) and N.J.A.C. 12:235-1.6. Minimum Employer's Liability \$1,000,000.00.

General Liability Insurance

This insurance shall have limits of not less than \$3,000,000.00 any one person and \$3,000,000.00 any one accident for bodily injury and \$3,000,000.00 aggregate for property damage, and shall be maintained in force during the life of the contract.

Automobile Liability Insurance

This insurance covering contractor for claims arising from owned, hired and non-owned vehicles with limits of not less than \$3,000,000.00 any one person and \$3,000,000.00 any one accident for bodily injury and \$3,000,000.00 each accident for property damage, shall be maintained in force during the life of this contract by the contractor.

Professional Liability/Malpractice Insurance Policy (if applicable)

Coverage in the amount of \$2,000,000.00/occurrence, \$4,000,000.00 aggregate and assurance that each such policy for each staff member remains full and in effect while providing services for owner.

The contractor shall provide the owner with a Certificate of Insurance naming the County of Somerset as additionally insured, evidencing the existence of required insurance prior to the commission of work. Said insurance must include coverage for complete operations, contractual insurance and independent contractor or subcontractor insurance, where and if applicable.

Errors and Omissions Insurance

A. The contractor shall purchase and maintain during the entire period of this contract, errors and omissions insurance that shall protect the contractor and the County from any and all claims that may arise out of or result from the contractor's performance of this contract. Specifically, the errors and omissions insurance shall have limits of not less than \$2,000,000.00 dollars per occurrence and \$4,000,000.00 dollars in the aggregate.

B. Certificates of the Required Insurance

Certificates as listed above shall be submitted along with the contract as evidence covering Errors and Omissions insurance. Such coverage shall be with acceptable insurance companies operating on an admitted basis in the State of New Jersey.

The contractor shall provide the Somerset County Park Commission with a Certificate of Insurance naming the County, its employees, officers, and agents as additionally insured, and evidencing the existence of required insurance prior to the commission of work.

Somerset County Park Commission will not accept Mutual Limitation of Liability terms.

2.8.11 Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 - HIPAA (If Applicable)

Both parties agree to comply with all requirements of the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") as maybe amended from time to time, and the corresponding HIPAA regulations for the confidentiality and security of medical information.

The Contractor shall:

- Not use or disclose protected health information other than as permitted or required by law
- Use appropriate safeguards to protect the confidentiality of the information
- Report any use or disclosure not permitted

The contractor, by execution of the contract, shall thereby indemnify and hold the owner harmless from any and all liabilities, claims, actions, costs and penalties which may be incurred as the result of the failure of the contractor to comply with the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) or any other statute or case law protecting the privacy of persons using its services.

2.8.12 Proof of Licensure

Proof of licensure for providing Services in the State of New Jersey, for either the firm or the person responsible for the work, shall be provided as required.

2.8.13 Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran – P.L. 2012, c. 25

P.L. 2012, c.25 prohibits State and local public contracts with persons or entities engaging in certain investment activities in energy or finance sectors of Iran.

2.8.14 Prompt Payment – Goods & Services– P.L. 2019, C.127 (LFN 2019-02 1/23/19)

P.L. 2018, c. 127 establishes a prompt payment requirement that applies to goods and services contracts a contracting unit awards to a "business concern" under the Local Public Contracts Law (LPCL). The law applies to all goods and services contracts awarded on or after February 1, 2019 (the law's effective date) regardless of dollar amount and any contracts requiring either a single payment or multiple payments. The law does not change the prompt payment requirements for improvements to real property and structures as set forth in N.J.S.A. 2A:30A- 1 et seq. and described in LFN 2006-21. The law defines "Business Concern" as any person engaged in a trade or business, including a private nonprofit entity operating as an independent contractor, providing goods and services directly to a contracting unit or to a designated third party and operating pursuant to a contract with a contracting unit which requires either a single payment or multiple payments, but shall not include a "public utility" as defined in N.J.S.A. 48:2.13.

2.8.00 Reserved

2.9 Public Emergency

In the event of a Public Emergency declared at the Local, State or Federal Level, if the owner opts to extend terms and conditions of this RFP, the contractor agrees to extend the terms and

conditions of this RFP, whether existing, expiring or expired no longer than six months, for goods and/or services for the duration of the emergency. In the event the original contractor cannot meet this requirement, the owner may solicit the goods and/or services from any bidder on this contract.

2.10 Multiple Proposals Not Accepted

More than one proposal from an individual, a firm or partnership, a corporation or association under the same or different names shall not be considered.

2.11 Subcontractors

The owner will consider the primary contractor to be the sole point of contact with regard to contract matters. The primary contractor will be required to assume sole responsibility for delivery of all services.

2.11.1 Use of Sub-consultants

Respondent may find it advantageous to include sub-consultants in their proposal. Such an arrangement is acceptable provided that the relationship between firms is clearly defined and the method of maintaining proper project management and oversight is described within the proposal. The use of sub-consultants is left to the discretion of respondent, provided that the criteria of adequate capability in all areas of the scope of work is met. Any sub-consultants must be identified in the same manner as the primary consultant.

2.12 Failure to Enter Contract

Should the respondent, to whom the contract is awarded, fail to enter into a contract within ten (10) days, Sundays and holidays excepted, the owner may then, at its option, accept the proposal of another respondent.

2.13 Commencement of Work

The contractor agrees to commence work after the date of award by the owner and upon notice from the using department.

2.14 Time of Completion

It is hereby understood and mutually agreed, by and between the respondent and the owner, that the date on which the work shall be substantially complete as specified in the RFP is an essential condition of this contract. It is further mutually understood and agreed that the work and contract time embraced in this Contract shall commence on the date specified and that the resulting contract shall be completed in sequence and time frames identified by the owner.

The respondent agrees that said services shall be processed regularly, diligently, and uninterruptedly at such rate of progress as will ensure full completion thereof within the time specified. It is expressly understood and agreed, by and between the respondent and the owner, that the time of completion of the services described herein is a reasonable time for the completion of it.

2.15 Termination of Contract

If, through any cause, the contractor shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner obligations under the Contract or if the contractor violates any requirements of the Contract, the owner shall thereupon have the right to terminate the Contract by giving written notice to the contractor of such termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed effective date of the termination. Such termination shall relieve the owner of any obligation for the balances to the contractor of any sum or sums set forth in the Contract.

The contractor agrees to indemnify and hold the owner harmless from any liability to subcontractors/suppliers concerning payment for work performed or goods supplied arising out of the lawful termination of the Contract by the owner under this provision.

In case of default by the contractor, the owner may procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.

2.16 Non-Allocation of Funding Termination

Each fiscal year payment obligation of the Owner is conditioned upon the availability of Owner funds appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of any services performed by the Contractor hereunder, whether in whole or in part, the Owner at the end of any particular fiscal year may terminate such services. The Owner will notify the Contractor in writing immediately of any services that will be affected by a shortage of appropriated funds. This provision shall not be construed so as to permit the Owner to terminate this Agreement during the term, or any service hereunder, merely in order to acquire identical services from a third-party contractor.

2.17 Force Majeure

Neither party shall be responsible for any resulting loss or obligation to fulfill duties as specified in any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement if the fulfillment of any term or provision of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any revolutions, insurrections, riots, wars, acts of enemies, national emergencies, strikes, floods, fires, acts of God, or by any cause not within the control of the party whose performance is interfered with which by the exercise of reasonable diligence such party is unable to prevent. Additionally, if the fulfillment of any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any court order, or action or injunction or other such agreement, this Agreement shall become voidable by the Somerset County Park Commission by notice to each party.

2.18 The owner and the Contractor each bind themselves and their successors, executors, administrators, heirs and assigns and legal representatives of the other party respecting all covenants and agreements and obligations of this contract.

2.19 The terms of this contract shall be construed and interpreted, and all respective rights and duties of the parties shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

2.20 Challenge of Specifications

Any respondent who wishes to challenge a specification shall file such challenge in writing with the Purchasing Agent no less than three (3) business days prior to the opening of the RFP's.

Challenges filed after that time shall be considered void and having no impact on the owner or the award of contract.

2.21 Payment

Invoices shall be submitted monthly and must specify, in detail, the period for which payment is claimed, the services performed during the prescribed period, the amount claimed and correlation between the services claimed, all backup documentation (mileage, time logs, receipts for expenses, etc.), amount remaining in total balance, and the Proposal Cost Form.

Somerset County Park Commission will provide a sample Progress Report and Invoice for the Hired Consultant to ensure compliance.

The owner may withhold all or partial payments on account of subsequently discovered evidence including but not limited to the following:

- 1 Deliverables not complying with the project specification;
- 2 Claims filed or responsible evidence indicating probability of filing claims;

3 A reasonable doubt that the Contract can be completed for the balance then unpaid.

When the above grounds are removed, payment shall be made for amounts withheld because of them.

Invoices shall specify, in detail, the period for which payment is claimed, the services performed during the prescribed period, the amount claimed and correlation between the services claimed and the Proposal Cost Form.

2.22 Non-payment of Penalties and Interest on Overdue Bills

Public funds may be used to pay only for goods delivered or services rendered. Somerset County Park Commission will not pay penalties and/or interest on overdue bills. No employee is authorized to sign a letter of credit or any other document that represents a legal commitment on the part of the Somerset County Park Commission to pay additional fees.

2.23 Ownership of Material

The owner shall retain all of its rights and interest in any and all documents and property both hard copy and digital furnished by the owner to the contractor for the purpose of assisting the contractor in the performance of this contract. All such items shall be returned immediately to the owner at the expiration or termination of the contract or completion of any related services, pursuant thereto, whichever comes first. None of the documents and/or property shall, without the written consent of the owner, be disclosed to others or used by the contractor or permitted by the contractor to be used by their parties at any time except in the performance of the resulting contract.

Ownership of all data, materials and documentation originated and prepared for the owner pursuant to this contract shall belong exclusively to the owner. All data, reports, computerized information, programs and materials related to this project shall be delivered to and become the property of the owner upon completion of the project. The contractor shall not have the right to use, sell, or disclose the total of the interim or final work products, or make available to third parties, without the prior written consent of the owner. All information supplied to the owner may be required to be supplied on CD-ROM/USB flash drive media compatible with the owner's computer operating system windows based, Microsoft Office 2010.

Under state and federal statutes, certain government records are protected from public disclosure. The Somerset County Park Commission, the Contractor and any Subcontractors have a responsibility and an obligation to safeguard from public access an employee's personal information with which it has been entrusted when disclosure thereof would violate the employee's reasonable expectation of privacy. All payroll, personnel and health insurance related files are confidential. Additionally, the Contractor and any Subcontractors may be privy to sensitive law enforcement information or investigations during their review which must remain confidential. The Somerset County Park Commission reserves the right to make any public disclosure under the law. Also, among government records deemed confidential are administrative or technical information regarding computer hardware, software and networks that, if disclosed, would jeopardize computer security. The Contractor and any Subcontractor(s) are prohibited from the sale or distribution of all supplied information to any third party.

2.24 Source of Specifications/RFP Packages

Official Somerset County Park Commission Request for Proposal (RFP) packages for routine goods and services are available on the County's and Somerset County Park Commission websites at www.co.somerset.nj.us and www.somersetcountyparks.org at no cost to the prospective respondents. RFPs ***must be signed in ink by the respondent***; all quotations shall be made with a typewriter/computer or pen and ink. Any quotation showing any erasure alteration must be initialed by the respondent in ink. Unit prices and totals are to be inserted in spaces provided.

3. Scope of Work (SOW)

3.1. PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT

The vendor shall provide an all-in-one golf management system that includes a customer database, web-based tee sheet, tee time reservation system, and point of sale (POS) services at six (6) golf course locations in Somerset County that are operated by the Somerset County Park Commission (hereinafter "Park Commission").

The vendor shall have expertise in golf software management and website development for public and/or other daily fee golf courses with multiple golf courses operating in an integrated environment.

3.2. INTRODUCTION

The CONTRACTOR shall have proven experience in the delivery of an all-in-one golf management system and related point of sale services, which shall be installed at multiple locations in accordance with the specifications stated herein for Neshanic Valley Golf Course, Neshanic Valley Academy Course, Spooky Brook Golf Course, Warrenbrook Golf Course, Quail Brook Golf Course and Green Knoll Golf Course.

The current contract for the existing golf management system is scheduled to end on November 20, 2023. Therefore, the new system shall be fully operational by **6:30am on November 21, 2023** at the below named six (6) golf courses.

The CONTRACTOR shall complete all tasks for delivery of the golf management system at the following locations:

The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the following areas:

- c. On-going maintenance and support services for the system(s).
- d. Occasional custom report creation at the request of the COUNTY.
- e. The provision of credit card processing readers that have "chip" and "tap" capabilities for all locations that are Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards ("PCI DDS") compliant and receipt printers.

3.3 CUSTOMER DATA BASE

The Customer Data Base shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. 100% web/cloud based and requires zero onsite servers or downloading of any apps on tablets or PCs.
- b. Automatic scheduling of data backup to prevent loss of data.

- c. System provides for restoration of archived data.
- d. Ability to create custom reports.
- e. Software must have "Touch Screen" capabilities.
- f. System needs Training and Testing mode.
- g. Can be accessed from any internet-based device.
- h. Database updates done in real time.
- i. Automatic entry into database of all new users of reservation system.
- j. Ability to update/edit database information.
- k. Customer relationship management system that can prevent customer duplication, identify golfer use and transaction patterns, and assist management in marketing to these customers.
- l. Allow for multiple customizable player types and rights.
- m. Automated segmentation of e-mail lists based on player type and preferences.
- n. Ability to enter and query customer data such as name, address, email address, and telephone number.
- o. Specifically targeted e-mail databases based on customer profiles that are fully integrated into the cloud-based point of sale and tee sheet provider. No importing or exporting into a separate platform for emailing and texting.
- p. Integrated web-based customer information/email function that allows customers to add themselves to our database and segmented lists that prevents golfers from creating duplicate accounts based on various data points including e-mail address and phone number.

3.4. CLOUD BASED TEE SHEET

The Tee Sheet System shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. 100% web/cloud based and requires zero onsite servers or downloading of any apps on tablets or PCs.
- b. Accessible on any device from any location without limitations on how many users.
- c. Reporting capabilities that are integrated into the POS, can support multiple facilities with multiple configurations of 9, 18 and 27-hole golf courses, and can provide multiple types of views with multiple color-coding options.
- d. Ability to book 1, 2, 3 or 4 person groups in a single tee time.
- e. Automated e-mail confirmation for all tee times, booked online, in-person or over the phone.
- f. Flexible and customizable rate and price categories.
- g. Option for customizable templates for tee sheets, inventory items, services, etc.
- h. Ability to review booking history for a single tee time and would be able to review all bookings and cancellations linked to an individual tee time in one inquiry/report.
- i. Drag and drop functionally in order to move tee times without having to save, cut, copy, or paste.
- j. Provide an option to repeat a tee time for as far out as desired with the following options: once, daily, weekly, and biweekly.
- k. Ability to create shotgun starts and print cart signs.
- l. Ability to create blocks for tournaments, events, etc., with the ability to modify the time increment by clicking and dragging.
- m. Ability to connect to a local Doppler radar system for weather tracking.
- n. Visual indication of golfers that are checked-in.
- o. Support WAN (Wide Area Configurations) for management of multiple courses from several locations.

- p. Support automatic check-in of golfers.
- q. Support and supply bar code registration key fobs.
- r. Ability to change tee time intervals within the day or specific date ranges.
- s. Set turn times for each nine holes of play.
- t. Ability to maintain notes on individual golfers, outings, and leagues.

3.5. TEE TIME RESERVATION SYSTEM

The Tee Time Reservation System shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. 100% web/cloud based and requires zero onsite servers or downloading of any apps on tablets or PC's.
- b. Mobile and non-mobile optimized website integrated online booking engine with customizable booking rules and that allows golfers to book tee times in real time, can identify and treat golfers differently depending on the customer type, and can be accessed by non-registered golfers. The ability for online reservations to be linked with each golfer's specific price class and all golfer access shall require credit card validation.
- c. Ability to book 1, 2, 3 or 4 person groups in a single tee time.
- d. Automated e-mail confirmation for all tee times, booked online, in-person or over the phone.
- e. Allow user to view multiple course availability on one screen.
- f. Restrict available times base upon player types.
- g. Restrict "days out" booking based upon different player types.
- h. Allow golfers ability to check for available tee times at all courses without prior registration.
- i. Customer's ability to modify or cancel reservation in accordance with defined policies.
- j. Customer's ability to login to system to edit user profile including unique password.
- k. Interactive Graphical Calendar displays days out availability based on golfer type.
- l. Fully customizable tee time booking engine (TTBE)- i.e. graphics, colors, layout, rules, policies, etc.
- m. Days out restriction can be set based on user/membership level.
- n. Allow searches for available tee times at all courses simultaneously with one request.

3.6. CLOUD BASED GOLF SPECIFIC POINT OF SALE ("POS")

The golf specific POS shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Screens must be user-friendly, and the system must be quick and responsive with minimum keystrokes for each transaction.
- b. Be 100% web based and requires zero onsite servers or downloading of any apps on tablets or PCs. Users may be able to access the POS from any location, using any device that can connect to the internet.
- c. Include a gift certificate management and accounting system that allows certificates to be purchased at any facility, or online and redeemed at any facility regardless of where it was purchased. POS shall digitally store gift card balances and display those balances on the POS screen without having to go into a separate screen or module. Gift cards shall have no user/finance fees.
- d. Unlimited quick buttons that can be sorted by columns, color codes and drop downs. Touch screen POS ability.
- e. Digitally store and display passes, registrations, and memberships on the POS screen without having to go into a separate screen or module.

- f. Screen must display the expiration date of a registration or membership.
- g. Easy auto-renewal feature for passes, registrations, or memberships.
- h. Include a starter interface for the tee sheet system.
- i. Allow customizable receipt messages.
- j. Two (2) credit card chip readers at all locations.
- k. Course specific ability to access change, add, delete and edit touch screen buttons.
- l. Real time status reports to include cash, and all day's transactions.
- m. Ability to reprint day's transactions.
- n. Access to update rates and other features must be user friendly and available to COUNTY staff.
- o. Move between the tee sheet and point of sale with one click of a button without losing data on either screen.
- p. Can accommodate unlimited member levels and "golfer types".
- q. Allows user to quickly change the SKU brought in from tee sheet by selecting it and choosing the new rate.
- r. Must be configured with an integrated credit card processing system that is Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards ("PCI DDS") compliant.
- s. Support issuing of prorated rain check based on how many holes were played and how much customer originally paid.
- t. Visually displays indication on tee sheet that a customer has checked in, paid, received a raincheck, and/or refunded.
- u. Ability to pull up complete purchase history of transaction for refund and refund tracking.
- v. Provide history of individual's purchases.
- w. Easily split the bill for customers who want to pay for just their purchases.
- x. Quickly remove the tax on an item for tax exempt purchasers such as charities or churches.
- y. Apply a tax to a miscellaneous purchase.
- z. Apply multiple tax types to an item.
- aa. Track voids and returns.
- bb. Quickly delete or add items from the sale if customer changes mind without voiding sale.
- cc. Return the whole ticket by transaction number.
- dd. Apply general ledger account codes to individual departments for electronic posting to accounting system.
- ee. Ability to track different payment methods (e.g., cash, credit cards, gift cards) separately.
- ff. Ability to associate credit card and gift card payments to specific account.
- gg. Ability to store approval codes in transaction records and ability to locate approval codes in reports.

3.7. INVENTORY MANAGEMENT

The Inventory Management POS shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Have modern inventory management capabilities that can manage transactions via keyboard entry and bar code scanner and track all stock items in the pro-shop.
- b. Have an inventory database that supports multiple facility operations and can be partitioned by facility.
- c. Have the ability to add and delete inventory, tender, and other buttons to the POS interface.
- d. Have the ability to use manufacturer SKU codes or generate and print SKU codes.

- e. Have the ability to combine multiple inventory items into one SKU code.
- f. Have multiple menus and sub menus for inventory items and service.

3.8. E-MAIL/MARKETING FEATURES

The Email and Marketing features shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- c. Bounce management- system monitors email bounces automatically.

3.9. TEXT FEATURES

The Text features shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Ability to send mass text messages to groups or individuals.
- b. Ability to send out text reminders of tee times.

3.10. MARKETING TOOLS AND RESOURCES

The Marketing Tools and Resources shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Promotional Materials Library of web and email-based promotions available.
 - Professionally written sales letter templates provided for memberships, outings, etc.
 - Image library with golf related stock images for use on the website and other marketing materials.
- b. Unlimited text messaging that is fully integrated into the cloud-based point of sale and tee sheet program.
- c. Website Development and Support Services: Ability to provide development, including semi-custom design and coding of six (6) client-specific websites that include a template content management portal. The minimum technical requirements/supported browsers for the highest quality as are follows: Chrome, Safari, and Microsoft Edge, and sizing should be responsive to automatically fit desktop/mobile screens.

3.11. ADVANCED REPORTING

The Advanced Reporting features shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Ability to extract daily, weekly, monthly, and annual information and compare it to previous time periods.
- b. Ability to create custom reports, centrally and at individual locations (Report Writer).
- c. Ability to create custom financial reports for each golf course individually as well as a group of six.
- d. Custom financial reports must include Gross Sales, Sales Tax Collected, Net Sales, Total Credit Card Receipts, Total Cash Receipts, Total Gift Cards Redeemed, Total Trade-In Credits.
- e. Reporting should show Gross Sales versus Total Payments and be able to reconcile same for any chosen period of time.

- f. Ability to schedule any available report to be emailed to any user-designated email address(es) on any day or time desired and be able to repeat that delivery according to a predetermined schedule.
- g. Ability to track golfer revenue by location for any day/date range.
- h. Comparison of current and prior years using course defined date and time range.
- i. No show reports.
- j. Reports must be available for download at any time.
- k. Reports must be available in PDF, Excel, and CSV formats.

3.12. SYSTEM COMPATIBILITY

The System Compatibility shall possess the ability to operate within COUNTY's current system which includes:

- a. Windows 10 environment with 100 megabits (Mbps) of bandwidth at each of the six (6) golf courses.
- b. The minimum technical requirements/supported browsers for the highest quality are as follows: Chrome, Safari, and Microsoft Edge, and sizing should be responsive to automatically fit desktop/mobile screens.

3.13. HARDWARE REQUIREMENTS

The Hardware requirements shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Credit card processing readers that have "chip" and "tap" capabilities for all locations that are Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards ("PCI DDS") compliant and receipt printers.

3.14. SECURITY

The system's Security shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. An Employee Permissions module to allow COUNTY administrator(s) to control what employees see and do within the software, i.e., allow employees to create or view tee times while prohibiting them from editing or deleting tee times, restricting employees from deleting a sale without a manager's permission, and have multiple levels or password protected security access to components and features of the system.
- b. A password management system.
- c. A facility specific POS interface that loads when the user logs into the system and limits the users access to other facilities depending on levels of access granted.
- d. Customizable registered and non-registered booking rules and rights for the online tee sheet.
- e. Tee time locks that prohibit golfers and/or staff from booking the same open tee time at the same time accidentally and that do not require a manual screen refresh.

3.15. ACCOUNTING

The system's accounting features shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Ability to add multiple General Ledger (GL) accounts and tie one or more of them to individual inventory, service, or golf items.
- b. Ability to add multiple tax types and handle taxable and non-taxable transactions.
- c. Facilitate multi-tender payments including cash, check, credit card, gift certificate/card, and rain check.

- d. Summary and detailed reporting of revenues, rounds, sales, returns, rainchecks, gift cards, tee time reservations, no shows, memberships, etc., that can be partitioned by facility or as a group of facilities.
- e. Detailed inventory reports with exceptions, inventory levels, reorder levels, costs of goods sold, etc.
- f. An audit trail with the ability to track transactions by facility and user.

3.16. SERVICE AND SUPPORT

The CONTRACTOR'S service and support shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. Unlimited phone and e-mail support available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- b. Unlimited on-line training.
- c. Data entry assistance as needed.
- d. Data is protected, secure and backed up with redundancies.
- e. All data is private and owned by the COUNTY.

3.17. GOLF MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE MAINTENANCE

The golf management software provider shall be able to provide:

- a. Monthly updates to the software at no cost.
- b. Cloud-based software that is accessible on any device, anywhere without having to download any apps or programs on any device.
- c. A fully multi-course solution, which can share one customer database at all courses.

4. Proposal Requirements

4.1 Qualification Statement

A statement is to be provided by the respondent who will serve as the primary contractor. The statement shall set forth brief details of the firm's principal activities, the number of personnel in the firm and the firm's location. Please provide a list of (3) three clients for whom similar services have been provided. Include the following in your response:

1. Name of government agency.
2. Contact person's name, position, and current telephone number.
3. Dates, cost and scope of service.
4. Status and comments

4.2 Key Personnel Information

The respondent shall provide the identity and the professional credentials of the principals and other key personnel either working for the contractor and their areas of responsibilities.

4.3 Subcontractors

Respondents may engage the services of subcontractors for completion of this project. If their proposal involves any subcontractors, full details on the nature of the work to be performed by them and the location in which the work is to be performed must be provided. The respondent understands that if selected, the owner prior to initiating any subcontracted work, must approve the use of subcontractors in writing. (Refer to Section 2.11 and Item 2.11.1 for more details)

4.5 Location of Servicing Office

5. Evaluation, Review and Selection Process

5.1 Proposals to Remain Subject to Acceptance

RFP responses shall remain open for a period of sixty (60) calendar days from the stated submittal. The owner will either award the Contract within the applicable time period or reject all proposals.

The owner may extend the decision to award or reject all proposals beyond the sixty (60) calendar days when the proposals of any respondents who consent thereto may, at the request of the owner, be held for consideration for such longer period as may be agreed.

5.2 Rejection of Proposals

The owner reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, or to reject any proposals if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of such respondent fails to satisfy the owner that such respondent is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the RFP and to complete the work contemplated therein. The owner reserves the right to waive any minor informality in the RFP.

5.3 Evaluation Process

An evaluation team will review all proposals to determine if they satisfy the Proposal Requirements, determine if a proposal should be rejected and evaluate the proposals based upon the Evaluation Criteria. The highest-ranking respondent will then be recommended to the governing body for award of contract, based on most advantageous price and other factors. The Somerset County Park Commission reserves the right to reach out to the respondents to get clarification on Proposals on specific items if necessary during the deliberation process.

Evaluation Team – RFP respondents are prohibited from contacting any member of the evaluation team directly without a formal invitation. If it is found that a respondent has attempted to discuss their proposal with a team member without an invite then their proposal may be deemed unresponsive. All questions during the evaluation period shall be directed to the Purchasing Agent.

5.4 Evaluation Criteria

The criteria considered in the evaluation of each proposal follows. The arrangement of the criteria is not meant to imply order of importance in the selection process. All criteria will be used to select the successful respondent.

This will be based on the quality of the content of the RFP and the respondent's ability to communicate a thorough understanding of the required tasks and the approach to meet the scope of work outlined in the RFP. The proposals will be evaluated for general compliance with instructions and requests issued in the RFP. Non-compliance with significant instructions will be grounds for disqualification of proposals.

Expertise of the firm shall be demonstrated by past contract successes providing government agencies with similar services. The respondent will be evaluated on knowledge, experience, prior collaboration and successful completion of projects/services similar to that requested in this RFPQ. In addition to relevant experience, respondents shall provide personnel qualifications in the Proposal. (See 4.1 and 4.2).

5.4.4 Ability to Complete the Project/Services in a Timely Manner
